BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

- √ K-6 single grade classes across the division
- ✓ Elimination of school fees K-8; reduction in high school athletic fees
- √ Small class size averages: 20 for K-3; 25 for 4-8
- ✓ Infrastructure improvements in every school to support grade reconfiguration
- ✓ Additional Teachers (11) and EAS (11) to support success for all students

Impact to Local Taxpayers

The provincial government has changed from the former 50% property tax rebate, to a "homeowners affordable tax credit" of \$1500.

This means that properties assessed at approx. \$340,000 and below will effectively not pay education tax.

A property assessed at \$400,000 will pay approx. \$270 / year.

Last year, a property assessed at \$400,000 would have had an education tax bill of approximately \$885/year.
